## A. Mayor's Announcements

- Mayor Hallman stated that the StormReady® Program was started in Tulsa, OK, in 1999 to help arm America's communities with communication and skills needed to save lives and property during storm events. Tempe applied for this program in January. He introduced David Runyan of the Phoenix Office of the National Weather Service who presented a certificate of achievement to the Fire Chief Cliff Jones, and HazMat Specialist Alan Jensen. This certificate designates Tempe as a StormReady® community.
- Mayor Hallman summarized that **Kid Zone** is an award winning elementary school-age enrichment program administered by the City of Tempe in cooperation with the Tempe Elementary and Kyrene School Districts. He recognized the Kid Zone staff in the audience and introduced Patricia Weegar, Director of Instructional Services for the Kyrene Elementary School District, and Andrea Colby, Early Childhood Education Coordinator from Tempe Elementary School District. He further introduced school partners in honor of their commitment to the program: Dr. Ana Gomez del Castillo, Principal, Kyrene de los Ninos Elementary School; Kristin Fleming, 4th grade teacher, Broadmor Elementary School; and Mary K. Harding, Secretary, Kyrene de la Mariposa He also introduced **Buddy Davis**, PE Specialist from Tempe Elementary School. Elementary School District #3, who received special recognition as "School District Hero." Mayor Hallman also introduced and presented certificates to representatives of the 1700 children enrolled in Kid Zone, who were selected for their kind and respectful attitude to others, initiative and enthusiastic participation, and display of cooperation, good sportsmanship, responsibility and leadership.
