Held the second public hearing and approved ORDINANCE NO. 2008.45 amending

Chapter 19 of the Tempe City Code relating to Motor Vehicles and Traffic by amending Section 19-142 relating to Parking Without Paying Designated Meter Prohibited.

Councilmember Navarro understood that this item concerns the parking meters that are being clogged and people are parking for free. For the person who is new in the area, will there be some sort of indication on the meter to indicate that this is not a place to park?

Chris Salomone responded that Downtown Tempe Community (DTC) will be putting red stickers on the face of the meters that specify, "If this meter is disabled, you may not park here." In addition, they will repair the jammed meters when they perform their daily collection of revenues. If the meter can't be fixed quickly, they will put a bag over the meter.

Councilmember Woods was concerned whether this would be enforceable. If someone is ticketed because the meter is broken and the person says it was not broken, how would it be enforced?

Mr. Salomone responded that the idea is to overcome the problem of people disabling the meters and this will eliminate much of that. Enforcement would ultimately be up to a judge to determine.

Motion by Vice Mayor Ellis to approve Item #20. Second by Councilmember Navarro. Motion passed on a roll call vote, 7-0.
