Teri informed the Board that they have developed a staff team known as the "LEAP Team" – Library Experiences Amazing the Public. This team will make suggestions regarding the development of a new service model in concert with the renovation of the library with the goal of providing amazing customer service..

### Agenda 4 – Maricopa County Reciprocal Borrowing Report

The Maricopa County Reciprocal Borrowing Report indicates that for the first six months of the fiscal year Tempe remains in the top three, following Phoenix and Chandler. The City received a check for \$40,977 which will go into the General Fund. The payment is based on \$29.00 per net non-resident borrower.

# Agenda 5 - Reading Ahoy Program

The Reading Ahoy program, funded by Gila River Indian Community grant has been a success and has been extended through the end of April. A total of 886 children have completed the program.
