Jayson Matthews called the meeting to order at 7:35 a.m.

Agenda Item 1 – Consideration of Meeting Minutes

Kevin Olson made a motion to approve all minutes. David Strang seconded the motion. The following minutes were approved as submitted:

Agenda Item 2 – Public Comments/Appearances

Agenda Item 3 – LRT Update

Gregg Kent presented the following information:

- Testing began in Tempe.
- An occasional train will run between 56th St. and Priest Dr. on Washington St.
- The Rural and University station structure is going in.
- Testing will start in Tempe with longer runs in late winter/ early spring over the bridge.

Amanda Nelson presented the following information:

- The station area planning process began in May.
- A station area planning charette will be held at the end of October, with an open house and stakeholder sessions.
- The commission will be invited to one session specifically for commission input.

Jyme Sue McLaren presented the following information:

- Mesa is beginning a two-mile east extension study.

Agenda Item 4 – Board and Commission Guidebook and Orientation

Greg Jordan presented the following information:

- The Tempe Learning Center put together guide books for the commission, and is also sponsoring trainings.

Agenda Item 5 – Regional Fare Policy

Greg Jordan presented the following information:

- The Regional Fare Policy update process has been a complex issue that has evolved over the years.
- Goals of the 2003-2004 Fare Policy were to take advantage of new technologies and eliminate transfer slips.
- The 2005 approved Fare Policy included:
 - The reduction of the \$0.60 base fare to \$0.50 for reduced fares to offset transfers, tickets, and tokens.
 - The introduction and ability to purchase a 1-day pass on the bus.
 - 3-day and 7-day rolling passes.
 - 31-day rolling pass to replace the monthly pass.
- Reasons for the 2007 Fare Policy update:
 - Two year delay of new regional fare collection system.
 - The last fare increase was in 1994.
 - Estimating the same pricing for the local bus and light rail.
- December 1, 2007 will launch and activate the new fare policy.

Kevin Olson made a motion to move forward and Corey Woods seconded the motion.

Agenda Item 6 – U.S. 60 Update

Jyme Sue McLaren presented the following information:

- ADOT initiated a process for improvements on the U.S. 60 that generally include the addition of one general purpose lane in each direction between Priest and McClintock Drives.

- Bid packets are being issued for Rio Salado south bank next week.
- The issue with SRP on the Western Canal has been resolved, and final design is being re-submitted and negotiated with SRP for 2 ½ years.

 - Judi Nelson presented the following information on Flex Car:
 - There was a huge turnout for the kick off, with 200 people signing up.
 - Usually \$35, the first year is free.
 - The gas card and keys are kept in the glove compartment.
 - Gas, insurance, and maintenance are paid for.
 - The fee is \$8-12 per hour, depending on the vehicle.
 - Cars are available as of Monday, September 17, 2007.
 - 10 cars are in the inventory, and are all low emission vehicles with GPS tracking systems.
